EU law on food information to consumers. Regulation (EU) No 1169/2011 on the provision of food information to consumers (FIC Regulation) entered into application on 13 December 2014. The obligation to provide nutrition information applies since 13 December 2016.. This Regulation provides in particular clearer and harmonised presentation of allergens (e.g. soy, nuts, gluten, and lactose) for ...

### Food information to consumers - legislation

1. This Regulation shall enter into force on the 20th day following that of its publication in the Official Journal of the European Union. 2. Articles 1 to 7 and Article 9(1) shall apply with effect from the 90th day following the date of publication in the Official Journal of the European Union of the measure referred to in Article 8(a).

### Biologicals: finished product - European Medicines Agency

Environmental Risk Assessment (ERA) considers the impact on the environment caused by, for example, the introduction of GM plants, the use of certain substances in food, feed and plant protection products, or the introduction and spread of plant pests. In specific fields, such as GMOs or pesticides, EFSA is requested by EU legislation to carry out ERA.
